Weight: Paper, while it may not be as light as a feather, is certainly lighter than even the thinnest of stone veneers. Versatility: Paper can be coloured,


textured, striped or patterned in any way you want - it's a blank canvas for your decorative theme



BULGARI OCTO FINISSIMO HARRODS EDITION

Bulgari's eight-sided dress model contains the thinnest automatic movement in any production watch. Just 10 examples of this 40mm, titanium-cased Harrods edition will be made, all with dias finished in the famous London store's green and gold livery and fitted with green alligator-skin straps. £12,000, bulgari.com, harrods.com



PIAGET ALTIPLANO

A slim and elegant Piaget dress watch was an essential piece of operational equipment for any self-respecting playboy during the 1960s and 70s. The Altiplano range continues the historic brand's tradition of making timepieces with ultra-thin movements, with this green-dial version having been created for the model's 60th anniversary in 2017. £23,300, piaget.com



LONGINES MASTER

Watches from the Master collection are the historic brand's biggest sellers and can be had with a variety of functions and in a range of dial colours and strap/bracelet combinations. But this simple, three-hand automatic with a small date window at three o'clock and "waffle" pattern dial still takes some beating.

CARL F BUCHERER MANERO POWERRESERVE

The Lucerne jeweller's in-house watch brand is fast expanding. An unusual feature of the Manero is the "peripheral" self-winding rotor that encircles the back of the movement, allowing it to be clearly seen. This version, with green dial and power reserve indicator, is limited to 188 pieces. £7,500, uk.bucherer.com



OMEGA SEAMASTER AQUA TERRA

Omega's yacht-worthy Seamaster Aqua Terra is water-resistant to a depth of 150m and features a dial based on the look of deck planks. The self-winding movement is certified for accuracy, anti-magnetism and shock resistance by the Swiss Federal Institute for Metrology and the watch is offered with a range of strap options. £4,000, omegawatches.com



BLANCPAIN FIFTY FATHOMS BATHYSCAPHE

Named after the submersible invented by Auguste Piccard, the Bathyscaphe version of Blancpain's Fifty Fathoms is smaller and slimmer than the original, but is still water resistant to 300m. This version, with "meteorite grey" dial, has a steel case and ceramic bezel insert. £7,650, blancpain.com

Studioart, the Italian company known for its innovative leather designs, has launched a collection of rugs. Pezzara is inspired by southern Italy's tradition of creating artisan rugs and blankets from leftover fabric and cotton threads. The ecofriendly collection is made from recycled fabrics and leather pieces.
